My Dear Friends in Christ...

As your read this I will be in Wellfleet, Massachusetts on Cape Cod. Because this is now a regular vacation destination for Chris and me, some friends say, "Oh, you're going there *again*?" Chris' 93 year-old (cute as a button and sharp as a tack) father lives on the Cape, as do his two brothers and their families. We love all of them, and so we go. But contrary to some perceptions, it's never really the "same old, same old."

Kids grow up, fall in love. Marital dynamics change, jobs vanish and pop up. Pa gets sick and then gets well. The one constant is that everyone is funny and able to laugh, most of the time. And the natural landscape remains beautiful, even as the ocean storms claim one sand barrier and build another in a new place.

And as we visit over the years, Chris and I bring somewhat changed selves each time we arrive. I have a dinner party while we are there, and we share and bring each other up to date and tell stories until we laugh till it hurts.

This month students are back in school...with new teachers, new courses, new activities, maybe new friends. Under the minor grumblings there is the sense of anticipation of what this new year will hold.

And this month, we here at Trinity go back to our regular service schedule. Our wonderful choir returns, and Sunday School begins again. And while there is a sense of gratitude for all the music or all the quiet, for the larger crowd, and perhaps for more church-friendly weather, we must not look at it as the "same old, same old." Because it never is. Our lives change...even over the summer. Our parish changes—budget issues, youth leadership needs, an awareness of a need to learn our own unique way of evangelizing, which simply means spreading the word that we are here and ready to befriend the people of God who need to be with us.

God is never done with us. Open your eyes and ears, and when you feel called to do so, do not be afraid to open your mouth, too, so that someone at work, in some after-school activity, in a club or organization you belong to, a neighbor, or a family member, can learn that you have found and are part of a special Christian community that seeks to bring Christ's love and peace into this world.


Music Notes
