Vestry Highlights Meeting was opened at 7:03 Minutes: Minutes from last meeting approved as presented? Yes Correspondence: None Ministry Areas – Team Reports as Available/Necessary:

A. Finance/Stewardship (David, Mary Helen)— Building insurance and Beverly insurance due this month, so Mary Helen needed to withdraw funds from the money mkt. Investments are way down. All other expenses are on track.

B. Leadership /Pastoral Care/Warden Report (Beverly, Charlie) —

Charlie reviewed new Letter of Agreement between the Vestry and Beverly. He highlighted the changes in yellow (see Letter of Agreement) He will review this document with Beverly when she returns from vacation. Motion to accept agreement with addition of Rector's documentation of mileage was made and seconded. Motion accepted.

C. Building/Grounds (Allen) Allen will meet with Ross Gibson about the roof this week. Allen will put up parking signs to discourage abuse by patients of our neighbor. Work Day 9/25 D. Worship/Music/Adult Ed. & Spiritual Life (Beverly/Judy/Margaret)-No Report

E. Youth/Sunday School (Robanne) – Started 9/12 3 students, 3 older children stayed to help with small children. Robanne wants to merge Sun. School with youth into some kind of program to take place at regular Sun. School time.

F. Outreach (Susan) -No Report

G. National/ Global Mission (Wendy) — We were able to raise sufficient funds to purchase 35 nets for the Nets for Life Program

H. Church Growth (Wendy)-Fall Fest 9/18. Robanne will try to put something together for the Trinity booth.

I. Fellowship (Mary Helen) — Fellowship Picnic 9/19, Potluck in Oct., Pie/Coffee after Thanksgiving Eve service, Mardi Gras in Jan.

J. Brotherhood Report—(David Calladine) Will serve lunch at the yard sale Dinner in Nov. at Wesley's.

From the Finance Chair...... The Rector, the Vestry, and the Finance Committee are very pleased to inform Trinity that the Episcopal Church Pension Fund has accepted Beverly's request for early retirement while allowing her to work, continuing as our rector, at about "2/3's time". This helps Trinity lower our operating expense by about \$25,000 per year in exchange for slightly less of Beverly's time. Most of this savings begins effective October 1, 2010, but the last 20% or so is effective May of 2011. It will take a little effort from all of us to adjust our priorities and get by with less of Beverly's time as we support her transition period before full retirement in a few years. This arrangement, plus other fiscal actions taken by the Vestry, should allow Trinity to achieve a balanced budget and grow from there back to supporting a full time rector in a few years when Beverly chooses to retire. Without strong support from Beverly and our Bishop, this would not have been possible. If you have any questions, please bring them to me or one of the Vestry members so we can address them properly. Thank you very much for your continuing support of Trinity. Matt Koenings

snacks and special prayers we "sent up to God" in a parachute. The older kids said they had a lot of fun and it was agreed they'd like to join us again for the next week.


Sherri Calladine, who also coordinates Sunday School, and I decided that we can't let this opportunity to reach a few youth slip away. She obtained a few youth oriented lessons that can be used for all ages, and prepared to use them for our first "hybrid" Sunday School/Youth Group meeting on September 19th. The topic was about lying. It was a terrific discussion with many thoughtful insights from all ages, using lessons from The Thoughtful Christian. The following week's topic was "Eating Responsibly" with discussions about how God wants us to use His resources to care for our bodies in a healthy way, feed the hungry and celebrate! Again, it was a very good discussion with multiple opportunities to connect the ideas to scripture. We will still be using the Episcopal Children's Curriculum as needed.

After a little evaluation of our newly, spontaneously formed group, we offer a few insights: 1. Trinity actually has more "youth" members than Sunday School aged students and we must make a committed effort to reach out to both groups; 2. Given our realities as a Parish, we have to be flexible and practical in our approach to providing programs to students which is 3. easy for parents.

We ask that all school age students (who are not serving) head straight to the Loft at 9:45am each Sunday. Parents, please update your children about our new program and encourage them to attend weekly. We will also be working, as a group, on a new name and asking families to help with snacks on a rotating basis. I have a message into the Elkton United Methodist Church in order to be included in their outings and activities. Details on that as I learn more.

With God's help and your prayers, we are making a difference. As always thanks for your continued support of our youth!


to next summer and another day together, but in the mean time the social committee has lots of plans.
