#### November 8, 2010 Vestry Highlights

Meeting was opened at 7:00

**Minutes:** Accepted by the 4 members.

Correspondence: Diocesan letter regarding Disaster Preparedness was read. Letter of

Agreement need to be approved (table till Dec. meeting).

Ministry Areas – Team Reports as Available/Necessary:

- **A. Finance/Stewardship (David, Mary Helen)** \$500 from Brotherhood for A/C for Trinity House. It has been put in savings. Utilities are lower than projected at this point. \$850 came in for Restoration. No explanation was given. Mary Helen to ask Carol. Matt and Mary Helen feel optimistic that we might not have to draw from savings again. October- good report, accepted as presented. Stewardship Sunday was 11/7. 13 pledges in so far for a total of \$37,000.
- **B.** Leadership /Pastoral Care/Warden Report (Beverly, Charlie) —Good potluck dinner. Pastoral Care: Rector's report reviewed.
- **C. Building/Grounds** (**Allen**) no report. Roof repair- Beverly- leak in Trinity House kitchen. New microphone- is covered by Beverly's cousin. This donation will also cover an ad for Thanksgiving Eve and for Christmas Eve services (Church Growth). Juniper under new sign will be removed and mulch put in. This will additional enable people to read what is on additional sign under new Trinity sign.
- **D.** Worship/Music/Adult Ed. & Spiritual Life (Beverly/Judy/Margaret)- Music is good. 1<sup>st</sup> Song of Isaiah will be back.
- **E.** Youth/Sunday School (Robanne)- Robanne and Sherry working with Youth Group in thematic units. They help explain to Sunday School Class.
- **F. Outreach (Susan)** —Food pantry is going well. Community Kitchen went well on 11/5/10. Shelter is 2<sup>nd</sup> week of December. Sign up is in Parish Hall.
- **G. National/ Global Mission (Wendy)** —Dec 12<sup>th</sup> is the dinner for the national Global Mission. Mary Helen explained empty bowls fundraising program. We might incorporate this at a later date.
- **H. Church Growth (Wendy)** Changeable portion of sign is covered by the juniper (see building and grounds.)
- **I. Fellowship** (Mary Helen) —Potluck dinner on 11/7 was good. Good group of close to 40. Greeter's meeting, instructions in the works.
- **J. Brotherhood Report (David Calladine)** Annual Dinner on Thursday at 6:30. Creche to be put up in December 11<sup>th</sup>.

**New Business:** Artificial flowers (silk arrangements) will be on altar when flowers are not designated by someone. Beverly to follow up on juniper issue.

What is it, what does it do, and who does it serve? These may be a few questions you have about the appeal we are making this month. At one time there actually was a children's home, but in the 1950's it was sold and women from the Diocese began a foundation with the proceeds. The original mission was to aid deserving and needy children, and for over 50 years we have continued to do the same through scholarships and camperships. The specific mission of the Children's Home Foundation is to raise and distribute money that will allow students from the Diocese to attend career and technology training (usually two or three year training) that will equip them to enter the world of work. We are looking for the student who would not otherwise be able to handle the financial burden of continuing education. We have sent students to a variety of schools: welding, nursing, auto mechanics, early childhood education, culinary, cosmetology and others. Our candidates need not be Episcopalian...just needy, deserving to succeed.

The board has also chosen to dedicate some of the foundation funds to sending youngsters to summer camps. Again, these are children who would not be able to afford the camp experience without scholarship support.

So, you will hear more from me this month and hope you will consider making a "Thanksgiving" contribution to this cause. Checks are to made to The Children's Home Foundation. Your donation is tax deductible.
