## My Dear Friends in Christ...

I grew up in the Northeast, on Long Island. We had our share of snow each winter, and when snow was forecast, especially as an overnight storm, my little brother and I were just as excited as we got about Santa on Christmas Eve. My bedroom had a great sky view, and the two of us would get up frequently to see if there would be *enough* snow to get us the winter bonanza we were hoping for. We knew when the fire horn blew ten times at 7 AM that it was, for sure, a SNOW DAY!!!!!

The day would be bliss; playing for hours in the drifts with the neighborhood kids, throwing snowballs, and building a snowman with Dad's help, as Mom baked cookies and made hot chocolate for our post-snow chill-chaser. Time stood still that day. No chores, no school work, just the gift of stolen hours and a special setting.

So I was shocked at myself a decade or two later, when I got up to some snow. I was in Manhattan where snow fell and usually turned gray before the day was over. I put on a long warm coat, boots, hat and scarf, and went out to catch the downtown bus to work. I walked (make that "plowed") through drifts and got to the completely empty bus-stop. I saw no traffic. So I walked the forty-three blocks to King Features Entertainment's offices near the U.N., propelled mostly by blizzard winds. Oh, yes. Can you spell "workaholic?" Can you comprehend "no life?" Needless to say, our offices were bolted shut. I called my boss on the lobby phone where a guard was snoozing. I told him where I was and he told me I was crazy. "IT'S A *SNOW DAY*, for heaven's sake. Go HOME!"

I was stunned to realize that twenty years passing had wiped out the joy, the gift, of a sudden day off. It took some doing and some years to learn to relax enough to see snow come down and smile with anticipation and excitement.

Flash forward to today. Chris and I are watching weather reports. Snow is predicted—but so far it could be one inch or more than six. It's fun to watch and wait and see. But it really feels like a gift when there is enough snow to stop things for a whole day (I realize there is a down-side, of course). What could possibly be the religious or spiritual message in a "snow day? "

Lots of people, including myself, sometimes, say they simply don't have the time for prayer or spiritual quiet time. The alarm goes off and the daily drama unfolds. Whether it is a houseful or just one person, there usually is a minute by minute schedule that gets us to the car, or to the TV, or the phone, or a list of things to do.

What if there was such a thing as a "snow minute," or "snow hour"-- a bit of time given to us because someone canceled an appointment, or because we are stuck in traffic, or we woke up early and can't get back to sleep? These moments are in our "schedule" even though we don't put them there. Instead of filling up the newly emptied time period with a new errand, or task, what if we delighted in the time and prayed to God for the Spirit to be in us for the rest of the day? What if we called someone we love and have been too busy to contact? What if we dreamed of something we've been wanting to do? Your heart and mind and soul need the bliss of a childhood snow day. Take the time God gives you and treasure it.



What is it, what does it do, and who does it serve? These may be a few questions you have about the appeal we are making this month. At one time there actually was a children's home, but in the 1950's it was sold and women from the Diocese began a foundation with the proceeds. The original mission was to aid deserving and needy children, and for over 50 years we have continued to do the same through scholarships and camperships. The specific mission of the Children's Home Foundation is to raise and distribute money that will allow students from the Diocese to attend career and technology training (usually two or three year training) that will equip them to enter the world of work. We are looking for the student who would not otherwise be able to handle the financial burden of continuing education. We have sent students to a variety of schools: welding, nursing, auto mechanics, early childhood education, culinary, cosmetology and others. Our candidates need not be Episcopalian...just needy, deserving to succeed.

The board has also chosen to dedicate some of the foundation funds to sending youngsters to summer camps. Again, these are children who would not be able to afford the camp experience without scholarship support. So, you will hear more from me this month and hope you will consider making a "Thanksgiving" contribution to this cause. Checks are to made to The Children's Home Foundation. Your donation is tax deductible.
