#### My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

About this time in Lent, parish priests begin to focus on Holy Week. We talk to each other and sigh, knowing we are probably going to get more than a little stressed out about the number of sermons, the different once-a-year liturgies, the special bulletins. This stress has its counterpart among parish secretaries, choirs and their directors, and altar guild members.

Meanwhile, the culture is purchasing new shoes, spring ties and dresses, as well as jelly beans and chocolate bunnies. Quite a few families are planning on making the first of their two yearly visits to a church. Lent and Easter are much easier for the average person than Advent and Christmas.

It has taken me quite a few years to find my way out of the "pressure" of Holy Week—that is, Palm Sunday and its Liturgy of the Palms (a high) and reading of the Passion (a deep low), Maundy Thursday with its uplifting celebration of the Love of God in Jesus shown in the giving of the first Eucharist and in the Foot-washing ceremony, as well as love-filled hymns and anthem, ending with the startlingly poignant Stripping of the Altar. Then there is Good Friday, the "Day of the Cross." This liturgy is powerful and beautiful, leaving us humble, stricken, and personally grateful in the shadow of the crucifixion.

These services have had more meaning and power to me personally and as a priest, as years of officiating have made me more able to absorb as well as conduct. Which brings me directly to you, the congregation. Yes, February and March are dreary and depressing, and maybe you just don't want to be brought "down" in mood. Time is precious, too. I get that. We all get that. But the amazing power of the Jesus story is nowhere and in no way better taken in, better felt, than in the remarkable, absorbing words, gestures, movement, emotions, and music of these Holy Week services.

Easter is a great and wonderful feast. But it can feel like a lively, "Thank God it's Spring" event. There is nothing amiss about that, unless that's all there is to it. It is our tradition and wisdom of going down into the depths, sorrows, and beauty of Holy Week that makes the shout of "He is Risen" so very wonderful.
