My Dear Friends in Christ...

While I was away, I bought myself a lottery ticket. I did not win the 63 million dollar prize. I had no idea in the world what I would do with that kind of money, but (surprise!) it was not going to be a problem.

I am very fortunate because even in economic and relationship ups and downs in my life, from childhood on, I have never felt deprived. I have had a place to live, enough to eat, and access to health care. These are great blessings, far more elusive in some lives than we would like to think.

My brother-in-law, Milton, is suddenly in the middle of a messy divorce. He is very anxious, depressed, and frightened. He has gone from finger-pointing and surprise to (wrongly) assuming the entire blame for all things wrong in his life. His home, family, and job, and perhaps his health, are all in peril.

Milt's family has rallied for him. We have all supported him with listening, counsel, and much needed money. Chris and I have been talking with him for months. Everyone is willing to listen (even when it is non-stop!). We each have some piece of "get help" advice. We tell him to go to a doctor, counselor, psychologist, psychiatrist. We all know how hard it is for an anxiety-paralyzed and depressed person to do something new, see someone new. But he has at least taken the step of calling doctors, getting some mild medications. So I have hope.

But I can see that Milt himself is fresh out of hope. He is the third son of a Bishop in the Episcopal Church, but I have never heard him say the word "God" (except in swearing...). He's no atheist, but he is not talking to or listening to God. He has no reflex to pray. He's okay with me praying for him, but that's about it.

This is painful for him, and for those of us who watch. The grace of knowing (at least somewhere in my heart and head) the desire to pray, how to , is something I (and many of us) take for granted. I get lazy and pray less and less sometimes. But I know, deep inside, that prayer to God is the foundation for all my days, all my actions, all my thoughts.

Teach your children, your grandchildren, to pray. Be conscious of your own need to live your life within the very real sight of God. Be an example—a gentle one—to your friends and family. Prayer is not just a nice, comforting thing. It can be more life changing than any lottery win. It is the key to life with God, and it can feel like rescue from a rip-tide, a ladder from a burning building. Reach out for rescue in prayer.
