A WORD FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN...

Transitions between pastors are not always as easy and fast as parishes would like, but we have good reason to hope that Trinity will be in good, concerned hands over the months ahead. Bishop Shand came to meet with the Vestry on Wednesday, October 19. At that meeting, Beverly announced that she would be leaving Trinity in early January for full retirement (she has been working ¾ time since last October). After sixteen years of ministry with Beverly, we will surely miss her, and we will have chances to make our goodbyes before she leaves. In the meantime, please know that your Vestry and I are ready, able, and hopeful as we begin this pastoral transition time.

Bishop Shand, who has been a good friend to Trinity over the years, as well as a good friend and colleague of our rector, assured the Vestry that he and Canon Heather Cook were very experienced in the transition process—32 parishes have gone through it since Bud became Bishop! He assured the Vestry that we would have coverage for our worship services and pastoral care as we move forward. The Diocese will guide us every step of the way to finding a new pastor.

The Vestry is committed to God's work in this parish. Carol Cummings, our Parish Secretary, is hardworking and talented, and she knows the inner workings of day-to-day life at Trinity. We ask your prayers and whatever help you can lend for a smooth transition to the next stage in Trinity's life as a people and place of God.

Bishop Shand will visit Trinity February 12th for our yearly confirmation service. This year we have asked him to participate in our yearly Congregational meeting to provide his guidance regarding our transition plan to a new rector. To combine these two activities, we have moved our Congregational meeting normally held the end of January to February 12th, 2012. Please plan to attend both events.

support. Since 1959

scholarships have been given to countless number of students seeking career and technical training. Also, we have made grants to non-traditional students who may need retraining for a more technologically intense workplace. Currently we have 17 students from Cecil County attending classes for nursing (our largest group), early childhood ed (our second largest), automotive diesel, criminal justice, medical billing etc. The nine counties of the Diocese on the Eastern Shore have a total of 101 students enrolled for a total of \$162,145.00. Camper-ships are available on a limited basis to our young people who otherwise would not be able to have a camping experience. This summer, three of our Trinity youth benefited from camper-ships.

We realize the difficult financial times we face, however, every dollar we receive helps to educate our youth who would not otherwise be able to get the education for a fulfilling career. The Foundation is managed by volunteers from each of our churches in the Diocese.

We ask for your prayers and support. Checks are to be payable to: Children's Home Foundation. Addressed envelopes will be in the back of the church or you may see Beverly or myself.


Total donations have not been processed through the bank but
