Greetings from Your Seminarian and Deacon-to-Be,

Seminarian? Deacon-to-Be? I'm quite certain that many of you are reading this and wondering "what is going on?"

Let me start by introducing myself to those of you who don't know me. I'm Darcy Williams, from St. Mary Anne's North East, a candidate for Holy Orders in the Diocese of Easton and a seminarian at Virginia Theological Seminary. Over the past 30 years, I have served as a lay leader in various capacities in the diocese and at St. Mary Anne's. I am the former principal of Tome School where I taught for 22 years. I am also a wife and a mother, although our two children are adults and live elsewhere. On September 29, Bishop Shand will ordain me as a transitional deacon and I will begin serving the five Episcopal parishes of Cecil County for the next nine months as a diocesan deacon while I complete my seminary studies.



Report from the Junior Warden

The Brotherhood of St. Andrew met in the Parish Hall on Saturday, August 18th, for their quarterly breakfast meeting. The next scheduled event is the Trinity Yard Sale on Saturday, September 22nd. Donations will be accepted for the Brotherhood table which will be managed by Gene Clay and Ben Cook. The Brotherhood Annual Dinner is scheduled for Thursday, November 8th, with details to come later. There will be a work day to assemble the creche for Advent on Saturday, December 1st, at 8:00 am. The next breakfast meeting of the Brotherhood is scheduled for January 19, 2013.

Our monthly work days for the summer have come to an end and I would like to thank all the volunteers who showed up and worked to help keep our property looking great!

Looking ahead to winter, our other summer project was to evaluate the possibility of converting our existing oil burners in the Church and Trinity House to natural gas. Some advantages are higher equipment efficiency, less maintenance, less fuel price volatility and no need to carry fuel inventory. The biggest advantage is that the cost of the fuel is significantly less. With the vestry's approval, we are in the process of converting these two buildings which should be complete by the end of September. The cost of the project is \$7000 and we should see an annual savings of about \$3500, resulting in a two year payback.

Anyone wishing to make a contribution to this capital project please see me or any member of the vestry, as this would help shorten the payback period and allow Trinity to start saving money sooner.
