

1 Chronicles 29:12 –14 says, "All riches and wealth come from you. Everything is a gift from you. We have only given back what is yours already."

Everyone knew that Nancy had just one dress. She would wash it at night to wear the next day. She was one of my parishioners when I served at St. Stephens' a small church in Nandi in North Western Kenya. Nancy was a widow, whose only income was gleaned from the corn she and her children raised on their tiny plot of land, but faithfully she tithed, sharing her blessings with the church.

Romans 14: 7-8 says, "None of us lives for himself only, none of us dies for himself. If we live, it is for the Lord that we live,"

God not only wants us to give to His church for it's mission, but he wants us to share our time, talents, and treasure with others. We cannot repay Him, but we can share His love by serving others.

At Trinity, we have a new ministry called meals ministry, whose mission it is to reach out to parishioners in need. The committee members meet and inform themselves of those who might need prayers and assistance. For example, meals are prepared for persons returning home after hospitalization.

The Women of Trinity and the men of the brotherhood not only give spiritual support to members, but reach out to the larger community as well. Each Sunday, those attending services bring non-perishable food for the food pantry, which provides relief to those who come to us in need. From the dedicated choir, altar guild, coffee hour host, collection counters, greeters, lay readers/ chalice bearers, nursery attendants, prayers of the people readers, Sunday school helpers, Sunday school teachers, ushers, youth group leaders to the volunteers who assist in keeping the church grounds pristine (gardeners and lawn mowers), God's work is being accomplished.

We have been blessed abundantly by God's love expressed through the hearts and hands of others. So many have given us the chance to be who we are today. As we think of stewardship month, let us also give our time, talents and treasure for the service of God and humanity.

When we lament about the tragedies that abound and question, "Why does suffering exist. Why doesn't God do something about it."

God answers, "I sent you."

DEACON'S CORNER

The two questions I have been asked most frequently since being ordained as a transitional deacon are: "What's the difference between a deacon and a transitional deacon?" and "I thought you were going to be ordained as a priest. What happened?"

Actually, the two questions are very much related. Some people are called to be deacons. Following a time of discernment of their call, and an extended period of study, they are ordained by the bishop as deacons. These individuals are called permanent or vocational deacons.

Others, like myself, are called to be priests. We also spend time in discernment and then attend seminary where we study for the priesthood. In the Episcopal, Anglican and Roman Catholic churches, all priests are first ordained as deacons and are referred to as transitional deacons during the time between diaconal ordination and ordination to the priesthood. This period of time is a minimum of six months, although it can be longer.

The word "deacon" comes from the Greek *diakonos* (δ_{14} (δ_{14} (δ_{14} (δ_{14} (δ_{14})), meaning "servant" and the diaconate is a servant ministry that underlies all other ordained ministries. One of the best explanations I've heard is one that the Rev. Dr. Sam Hartman, gave a few years ago when preaching at a diaconal ordination:

"The deacon represents, symbolizes, focuses and articulates the ministry and vocation we all share as Christians. . . All are called to represent and lead the community of faith. BUT, all ordained individuals – FIRST OF ALL – are called to embody and represent, to prod and promote, to be a catalyst for and a symbol for the ministry that all Christians share. Whatever else ordained leaders eventually might be called and ordered to do, the first and foundational ordained ministry is diaconal—the ministry of bringing the gifts and grace of the Good News of love and our care to the world and to the church."

We are all called to spread the Good News of Christ and to be God's hands and feet in the world. Deacons, both transitional and permanent, are called to a special ministry of servanthood and to be a conduit between the world and the Church, helping our community of faith to live out our baptismal covenant. As a priest, I will always also be a deacon, and be "ready to help and serve those in need" (BCP, Ordination of a Deacon, p 544).

I thank God for each of you, for the warm and generous welcome you have given me since I joined you in September. I am thankful for your guidance and support as I continue to learn and grow in my ministry. And I am blessed to have this opportunity to serve the five Episcopal parishes in Cecil County as your transitional deacon and to work with you, your vestries and your priests.

Help People Recover from Hurricane Sandy



Hurricane Sandy is a large, complex storm that swept through the Caribbean on October 25 before heading north along the eastern coast of the US and making landfall in central New Jersey on October 29.

The storm caused significant damage as well as loss of life, and many areas are experiencing record flooding and power outages. Blizzard warnings have been issued for parts of the Appalachian mountains.

Episcopal Relief & Development has reached out to partners in the Caribbean and along the US East Coast, and stands ready to respond. At this time, we ask that you continue to pray for all those who are impacted by the storm.

In addition, we have established a dedicated Hurricane Sandy Response Fund that will support the relief and recovery efforts of our partners in both the Caribbean and the US.

Our partners are currently in the process of conducting needs assessments and formulating relief activities. We will continue to be in touch with them as they minister to impacted communities.

In the United States, we have been in contact with over a dozen Diocesan Disaster Coordinators about activities on the diocesan and parish levels.

We will continue to be in touch with our partners through the immediate relief and long-term recovery phases of their storm response.
