I have developed an interest in looking at the past of Trinity Church. Some times looking at the past is not the best thing to do, because it may remind us of disappointments. But the past also awakens glorious moments that may be celebrated today.

From its inception, the church has faced challenges. For a brief period in the 1800's services had to be temporarily discontinued for financial reasons. After resurgence, a few years later it was badly damaged by fire, but the congregation valiantly refurbished the church. Florence Arbour in her article; "History of Trinity Episcopal Church: 1832-1974", reminds us that, "Sometimes it takes a crisis to bring out the real strength of a congregation."

Not only did our congregation overcome adversity in those early days, it persevered with God's help to build the faith community and ministries we have today. Through those difficult early days many ministries have emerged. Two I will highlight. The ladies of the parish emerged in the 1800's and galvanized the building of the rectory. Today they continue to be the heart of the parish with new missions. The Brotherhood of St. Andrews also reach out to the community with their Christmas in April ministry as well as continually supporting the church.

We begin a new church year with the season of Advent. As we look back at our challenges, let us also look forward with great anticipation and hope to the opportunities the new church year provides. As a congregation or as an individual, we begin this spiritual journey together.

Let this journey be a journey of reflection and discernment. Therefore, as we reflect on our experiences and challenges, let us look forward with great hope to the possibilities that Christ brings into our lives.

The advent wreath symbolizes the new church year. During this advent season we will explore the symbolic colors and what they mean in our lives. I invite all to share this spiritual journey by drawing closer to God and your neighbor. Together with open hearts, lets experience the joy that Christ the King brings into our hearts.

CHILDRENS HOME FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Hopefully everyone has received a letter from me concerning our campaign for the Children's Home Foundation scholarships. This is a Diocese of Easton sponsored charity. You may recall that shortly after the Civil War and until the 1950s we sponsored an orphanage. When Federal aid came to be and orphanages were no longer needed, our home was sold and the monies were put in trust to help less advantaged young people seek career or technical education after high school.

Our statistical report is astounding, indicating this school



year, 2012, we had a total amount of scholarship grants of \$172,900.00. This amount covers 102 students of which 16 are from Cecil County. Most of our students are in the nursing program, however, we have 4 in the automotive and diesel tech, culinary arts and others career interests. Campership grants are also available to our Camp Wright and other local camps. Seventy-five young people were sponsored totaling \$22,582.00. Your support is 100 per cent tax deductible.

The administrative work is done by volunteers from our Episcopal churches in the Diocese.

Thank you for your past generosity and again, your prayerful consideration will be appreciated.

In talking with you over the past few months, I have learned that there are a lot of really great things happening in each of the five Episcopal parishes in Cecil County and there are some wonderful ideas that deserve to be shared.

The first of these is *The Advent Conspiracy*, a movement that was started in 2006 as a way to help people remember the true meaning of Christmas and avoid some of the consumerism that has gripped our time of preparation. The *Advent Conspiracy* does this by encouraging us to Worship Fully, Spend Less, Give More and Love All. For more information about The Advent Conspiracy go to www.adventconspiracy.org. Watch the 2 minute video, read the info and see if you too want to become an Advent conspirator.

Many of us remember fondly the Advent Calendar we had as children. This year The Episcopal Church has partnered with the Brothers of the Society of St. John the Evangelist to create an online Advent Calendar. Beginning December 2, the site will provide a new image and a meditation each day. The calendar is posted at http://pinterest.com/iamepiscopalian/advent-calendar/.

Some parishes in this diocese are joining others in taking the Bible Challenge, committing to read the entire Bible in a year. A good time to start is on the First Sunday of Advent (December 2nd this year) or on January 1. If you are interested in participating as an individual or as a group go to http://thecenterforbiblicalstudies.org/read-the-bible-in-a-year/ for more information and a downloadable chart that outlines what to read each day. Instead of starting with Genesis and continuing through to the end of Revelation, this outline suggests a plan that encourages reading a few chapters from the Old Testament, a Psalm and a chapter from the New Testament each day.

The last thing to be shared this month is a list of the special events happening in our parishes during December. It is my hope that as we spend time together, we will find more ways to share our ideas, our ministries, and grow in Christian fellowship.
