



#### Deacon's Corner

The past month has been a busy one for your deacon. It began on December 1 with the Northern Convocation Youth Lock-In in Chestertown and ended on January 7, the last day of the 2013 General Ordination Exams. Between those two events came a retreat at Trinity Retreat Center in North Carolina, the final papers and reports for the two classes I took at Virginia Seminary this fall, "deaconing" for regular Sunday and Christmas services, and the other three days of GOE's. As I said, it has been a busy month!

The Northern Convocation Youth Lock-In was a "blast!" We had 24 young men and women from 5 parishes in the Northern Convocation come together at Emmanuel Chestertown for a night of fun, food, baking, a midnight Eucharist, more food, movies, good discussions, and very little sleep. By all accounts, everyone, including the adults, wants to continue to do more youth events as a convocation and to plan something for spring. St. Mary Anne's Youth Group has extended an invitation to the youth from our five Cecil County parishes to join them for regular youth group meetings Sundays from 4:30 – 6 PM.

General Ordination Exams (GOE's) are held each year in early January for graduating Episcopal seminarians as a means of assessing their proficiency in the seven canonical areas required for ordination. The areas covered are: Liturgy and Church Music, Holy Scriptures, Ethics and Moral Theology, Theory and Practice of Ministry, Church History, Christian Theology and Missiology, and Contemporary Society. If anyone has any interest in learning more about these exams or about life as a seminarian, I will be glad to answer your questions. Now that the exams are over, I will be back as your shared deacon for the remainder of the spring term and am looking forward to exploring ways that St. Mark's, St. Mary Anne's, Trinity Elkton, Augustine Parish and St. Stephen's can share our resources and continue to spread the light of Christ in our communities and do more things together. Maybe we can do a joint Lenten film series or plan a joint worship service for the Easter Vigil or – let's brainstorm; I look forward to hearing your ideas.
