

No Pain, No Gain

The church was founded on the day of Pentecost. But this was not without pain. The fulfillment of the Messianic event by the exalted Christ was not without a price. Throughout our lives we make sacrifices, though tiny in comparison to His. The pain Christ suffered upon the cross resulted in our birth as a church.

My father's struggle to provide school fees shifted from me to my siblings upon my graduation from high school. His diminutive statue but firm command directed me to a specific project. As a builder he needed lumber. The trees were placed on a stand and two men sawed, one above and one below. I was the one below. The men above kept quitting, but I stuck with it. My father surveyed the resulting lumber soberly. His only acknowledgement of my effort was to allow me to plant a plot of corn. With prayer and weeding, my crop was successful. I gave the money to my mother except for a small amount, which I used to purchase a dilapidated bicycle. The bicycle provided the freedom I needed to go to town to search for higher education. The sawdust in my eyes was worth the reward.

In his book, <u>The Revival We Need</u> by Oswald J. Smith. He talks about "Soul- Travail". He wrote, "We read in Isa. 66:8, that as soon as Zion travailed, she brought forth her children. Can children be born without pain? Can there be a birth without travail"

Under sin, we grieve, but under Christ, we celebrate God's Mercies from His steadfast Love. For this to happen, the presence and the working of the Holy Spirit is paramount. Through the gift of Pentecost, God's Love has been poured into our hearts (Romans 5:5b) and therefore we can rejoice in our hope, our sufferings and have hope in our disappointments. (Romans 5:2-5a).
