

#### Capital Campaign

I apologize for the delay in this report, but, on behalf of the Vestry and the Capital Campaign Committee, I wish to thank you for your support of our Capital Campaign. The Trinity family made magic again and rose to the challenge of \$40000 in the 40 days of Lent. We received 34 pledges totaling \$37,198. As of June 12, \$21,985.98 had been deposited.

You may have already seen that some of the capital funds have been put to use – the asphalt shingle roof on the Parish House has been replaced, the asbestos siding has been remediated, new window unit air-conditioners have been installed in the rectory, the mold in the closet has been remediated, and a lock-box has been placed on the thermostat in the church. It is your support that made these projects possible. THANK YOU!

To make it easier for you to submit your contribution, Capital Campaign designated envelopes have been placed in the pews.

#### Elkton Gas & Delmarva Power

Trinity has been spending between \$9000.00 and \$10,000.00 each year with Elkton Gas and Delmarva Power for heat, air conditioning, and electric service. The water bill has been fixed by the Town of Elkton at \$150.69/quarter regardless of usage and represents a reduction in cost.

Our mission is to reduce energy cost in all buildings. In the church itself, Hans Nafzinger and Larry Parker have programmed the temperature controls so that at 6:00 AM until 1:00 PM on Sundays the temperature will be 72 degrees. The remaining time will be programmed at 80 degrees. In the cold months the temperature will again be 72 degrees from 6:00 AM until 1:00 PM on Sundays and 60 degrees the balance of the time. Carol Cummings, Larry Parker, Hans Nafzinger, and Gordon Tozer all have keys so that the temperature in the church can be changed for special services. A similar programing system is anticipated for the Parish House in the future.

In the rectory, new air conditioners have been installed. These will be more efficient than before and are expected to save energy. We are hopeful that these thrusts will reduce Trinity's energy costs.

Your awareness, ideas, and help are necessary and will be appreciated.
