

Romans | Epiphany 2019

Episcopal organizations supporting the selected reading from Paul's Letter to Romans are now listed in a resource section of The Good Book Club that can be found in the website

www.goodbookclub.org (go to bottom of page with black background and click on - resources). Browsing this section will now allow all members of the Episcopal Church to tailor their reading of the sixteen chapters of Romans to fit their personal schedules. They will also be able to select resources that provide a wide range of interesting comment and will assist those who desire to participate in a group discussion.

Romans is considered an important foundation book of the new Jesus movement that addresses believers in Christ from the Jewish tradition and also believers of non-Jews, referred to as gentiles. It represents one the more challenging pieces of writing that has come to us from around 54 - 58 AD but is often classified as Paul's masterpiece.

The design of this effort will allow you to work at your own pace and use the desired resource materials of your choice so that at the end of Epiphany you will have refreshed your understanding of this important book of the New Testament.

Those parishioners at Trinity Church that would like to participate in an evening discussion group of Romans in the Parish Hall are asked to express their interest by signing up on the announcement sheet posted on the Vestry bulletin board in the Parish Hall.

The first organization meeting for the group will be held on Thursday, Jan.10 at 6:30 PM in the Parish Hall. The meeting is not expected to be more than one hour in duration.

INVITE*WELCOME*CONNECT

As we move into the New Year the IWC team remains focused on the challenge of meeting newcomers to Trinity. Insuring they are greeted promptly and develop the feeling that Trinity is a place where they and/or their families are welcome. This very important aspect of our ministry has been carried out by many and will need to be continued by even more in the days ahead.

In addition to continue with these two important elements of the ministry, i.e. Invite and Welcome, we must also begin to focus more earnestly on the element, Connect.

Connect begins with those who have the gift to generously listen to those coming through the doors of Trinity for the first time. It also continues into their early introduction to Trinity. It shouldn't be surprising that almost every person entering the doors of Trinity has a need to communicate with another individual who has faith in Jesus.

This initial contact continues as new individuals are introduced to other parishioners and offered assistance to determine if there are some groups that might be of particular interest to them. Someone entirely new to the Episcopal tradition might benefit from Christian Formation as expressed in our Church. This would lead to a more in depth discussion with the Rector or possibly an opportunity to participate in a group discussion.

At some point when new persons to the Church feel comfortable with the Parish and sense they are in a secure place they are likely to share their individual faith journey. This is likely an opportunity for a parishioner to reciprocate with their own story. This might possibly include how they found Trinity and why they have elected to continue to worship and serve in this Church. This authentic relationship between individuals becomes the challenge for each of us in the year ahead.
