The just concluded Diocesan Convention and sesquicentennial celebration was the most unique one ever celebrated on the Eastern shores of Maryland. The workshops facilitated by Rev. Canon Stephanie Speller, Jerusalem Greer, and Rev. Jay Sidebotham were very transformative and inspiring. For many, this was a golden opportunity to hear the presiding bishop teach and preach about the most emphasized movement, "The Jesus Movement, or The Way of Jesus." The movement is defined as "the ongoing community of people who center their lives on Jesus and who follow him into a loving, liberating, and life -giving relationship with God, each other, and creation."

Those who center their lives on Jesus and follow him have a dream because God had a dream say his grace. God's dream is "Love." Because God's dream is Love, the dream has been spread in all creation and hence this has become the mission of the Church. Love is liberating and life giving. Without love we are like ringing gongs.... (1 Corinthians 13:2).

In his sermon Bishop Curry said, "As has never been before, we need folks who are to be witnesses of the way of Jesus of Nazareth, witnesses of the way of love, and witness of a kind of Christianity that looks something like Jesus." (Acts 1:8) Without love we will have hatred. Hatred and love are two opposite poles.


To be witnesses of God's Love, we have to focus on the work of renewal. In his ten year project, our diocesan bishop has come up with a conversation document in which he has a vision for our diocese. In order to continue being instruments of God's dream we have to embark on the spiritual journey that focuses on the "goodness and loving kindness of God. This spiritual journey invites us to a desire for interior spiritual growth that seeks to deepen our intimate relationship with Jesus Christ", said Bishop San.

Let us therefore begin this journey of seeking God's dream, purpose, and plan for our lives by committing ourselves to a discipline of meditation and prayer in this Lenten Season.



## **Trinity Archives**

At our Annual Meeting in January, Larry Parker discussed his review of Trinity's historical documents. During the meeting there appeared to be a lot of interest by those in attendance to see the pictures and documents.

Larry Parker, Bill Smith, Sharon Arbour, Susan Burkholder and myself have had several meetings as an Ad Hoc Archive Committee. Sharon Arbour is an experienced Archivist.

The past several weeks Sharon and Susan have been working for hours upon hours, going through all of Trinity's historical records. They are categorizing all the records, and sending copies to the Maryland State Archives, and the Diocese of Easton. Sharon is also in the process of setting up all the historical documents so that they will be preserved for posterity. As this is being done, the committee will discuss ways to copy, catalogue, and have all the documents and pictures available for Trinity's Congregation along with the Cecil County Historical Society.
