

What Does Mardi Gras Mean to You?

I must confess that before I came to the United States I had not heard about Mardi Gras. The first time I learned about Mardi Gras was at Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria. I was invited by a friend to attend the Mardi Gras celebration that was organized by an Episcopal church in Arlington, Virginia. When I arrived I was overwhelmed by the atmosphere of a great party. People were joyous and were wearing festive attire and colorful beads. The food was bountiful and made from New Orleans recipes. Our mood was enhanced by the abundance of adult beverages.

As I write, a similar celebration will be held all over the United States. It is not organized by an Episcopal church, but by the NFL. It is called the Super Bowl. When my neighbor invited me to attend her party, she described all the food she would serve: chicken wings, pizza, and beer and she reminded me that I could wear my favorite team colors. So many people will watch the Super Bowl on television that a minute commercial will cost millions. I do not expect that there will be a mention of Lent.

The energy and money that is put into Mardi Gras and Super Bowl festivities is enormous. Many will fly to New Orleans for an authentic Mardi Gras atmosphere. Millions of flat screen television sets will be purchased for the enjoyment of the Super Bowl game parties. What is the real meaning of these festivities? The real meaning of these celebrations lies in the heart of the celebrant.

All over the world on February 13th 2013 churches will observe the beginning of the Lenten season. Some will host Mardi Gras festivities. Others will celebrate Shrove Tuesday with a pancake supper. I knew nothing about Mardi Gras until I came to this country, but I did observe the Lenten season. I remember in 1990 when I was in St. Paul's Kapsabet, a Bible college, I was asked what I was going to give up for Lent. I thought for a while and as I went through the possibilities on the list they had compiled, the only thing I could think of was butter. This meant that for 40 days I was going to eat bread without butter. That was quite an insignificant sacrifice, but with the combined sacrifices of my colleagues we saved three dollars, a significant amount for us, which was donated to a deaf school which neighbored our Bible college.

My view of Lenten discipline has changed much since then. Lent is not only about giving up something, it is much more. The Lenten season provides an opportunity for self re-examination, reflection and prayer. This process should not end on Palm Sunday, but should be a way of life as a disciple of Christ. When we remember Christ's suffering and sacrifice for us, Lent provides us the opportunity to demonstrate our Love of Christ. We do this by sharing our blessings with those who do not have. Our coordinators for the Trinity World Missions will explain more about this effort. This years' contributions will be given to help eradicate poverty. Our mission is to increase our sharing. In the northern convocation churches, we ask you to consider during this Lenten Season the work of our diocese by "keeping change to make change" in our diocese. Our theme for our diocesan convention in February is "Blessed to Be a Blessing."

Thank you all for attending our annual meeting and let us welcome our bishop The Rt. Rev. James Shand on February 17th 2013.


