In Maria Harris’ book, “Fashion Me a People,” she explains the five marks of a church’s curriculum. One of these marks is the “Koinonia,” which is a Greek word which may be defined as fellowship, community, communion, association or joint participation.

As is our mission and vision statement, we at Trinity come to church because of our deep need to feel a place where we can belong, uphold our traditions and seek fellowship as we strive to be whole in Christ Jesus.
