

Spring is my favorite time of year. For me, it's a time of hope and expectation. I love the colors – the various flowers, the shades of the sky, the green of the new grass, the pretty flowering trees. The days are getting longer and warmer. As a child, there were always special activities in the spring – field trips in elementary school, proms in high school, the knowledge that school would end soon and summer vacation would begin, piano & dance recitals. It was full of excitement. As much as I love the liturgical celebration of Christmas, I love the celebration of Easter, too.

Holy Week is wracked with such a roller coaster of emotion. It starts with the whole story told on Palm Sunday – talk about emotional rollercoaster. As a child, I always thought it was neat to receive palms, and frankly I still am excited to receive them; and last year it was extra special for me as it was the first time I was in a procession with a real donkey (at Immanuel at VTS). In the Catholic churches of my childhood, usually the priest would read the whole Passion gospel, but the congregation was expected to say the words, “Crucify Him”. My mother and I have never liked saying those words. As a child, I could not understand why the people would turn against Jesus. I could not imagine ordering the death of someone, especially someone as good as Jesus. It was so clearly wrong. As an adult, I still don't like saying those words, but I have a different perspective and realize how people can turn against someone, and how strong group mentality can be. I also realize how much Jesus went against the grain of accepted, traditional practices. Not too many people would be that bold or courageous to stand with someone who is so anti-establishment. Then, we come to Maundy Thursday which is another day of celebration and tragedy – Jesus's celebration of the seder (which itself is bipolar with a reflection of slavery and a celebration of freedom) with His closest friends yet the knowledge of His impending betrayal, suffering, and death. Then, we have the sadness of the events of Good Friday. Finally, we come to the hope and joy of the Resurrection Day.

At the end of the week, we celebrate Easter, and what a grand celebration it is! I enjoy the trappings – the beautiful lilies and flowers that decorate the church, the Easter finery, the Alleluias, the smells & bells. Although she was born on Easter Monday, this year Marina's birthday falls on Easter itself, so it will be extra special for me. Birth is such a miracle! I have always appreciated Easter as central to my faith. Over the altar of my childhood church was a huge crucifix with the words, “If Christ be not risen, then our faith is in vain” surrounding it. In the stained glass behind Trinity's altar are the words, “He is not here, He is risen”. Without Easter (the Resurrection), our faith in Jesus would be in vain. Jesus overcame death and opened the gates of heaven for all of us. Easter is such a testament of God's love for each of us! Knowing that, how can one not be hopeful!?

Like spring and Easter, the Diocesan Convention was full of hope and promise. Bishop San is very optimistic. In his homily, he said, “Be excited. God lives here and won't let us fail. Look through the window. Look for the new day that God is revealing to us.” Throughout the convention, he maintained a theme of revival, reimagination, and repurposing. He said, “A Risen Savior is incompatible with a dying church. We are church in renewal.... Each generation must be creative and imaginative in its current time. This pilgrim church is tough church. 149 years of destiny. Let God's Kingdom grow on these shores and prosper.” He laid out his vision for the next 3 years that includes: a series of planned events to celebrate our history; study of the early church's evangelism movement;

establishment of diaconal training and a school for lay leadership; a missionary for children and youth and communications; congregational vitality; partnership with the wider community; and staying true to a mission-shaped diocese and prayer-centered church. I think we all came away with a sense of hope and optimism.

I feel that the Trinity family is hopeful, too! Trinity magic continues and we continue to do great things. We have gained some new attendees and members, the Women of Trinity have added a monthly fun day, we have new acolytes, there are plans beginning to take shape to conduct a Treasure Hunt (an event similar to the Amazing Race), the Shared Ministry will bring new opportunities, we will participate in Christmas in April again. We spread our joy and passion for God, each other, and the community.

May every day be filled with hope and optimism!







Figure 41: The Trinity Episcopal Church uses polychrome stone and brick to create patterns as an important decorative feature.




Figure 24: Trinity Episcopal Church, Gothic Revival (1833/1868).

Churches are the most common building type constructed in the Gothic Revival style. The style is characterized by tall pointed forms and its characteristics are often incorporated with later styles. The Gothic Revival style was employed extensively in residential architecture by 1860. The Trinity Episcopal Church shows characteristics of Victorian sensibility with its playful polychrome masonry and cast-iron detailing from its 1868 remodel.
