



Acts of Kindness-28 AoK for Advent

Sunday, November 27, marked the start of our Advent season. This Advent we are embarking on a new Acts of Kindness Challenge – 28 AoK!! To really prepare us for this Christmas season and the celebration of Christ's birth, we are setting a goal of 28 Acts of Kindness by the members of our Trinity parish family. We will have a small Christmas tree in our Parish House that will enable 28 "ornaments" of snippets of the 28 Act of Kindness to be placed on it as they

are completed. This is similar to what we did in 2018 when we set a goal of 150 Acts of Kindness representing the 150 years of our Easton Diocese Sesquicentennial Celebration and posted snippets of those on a wall in the Parish House. And just as in 2018 when we exceeded our goal, we hope to exceed our goal in this challenge as well!!

So let's get started. Rather than examples of common kindnesses to our family and friends, please let these Acts of Kindness, be examples where you were truly moved by the Holy Spirit, to reach out in a way you typically do not do. Many of you may not know that the words, "act of kindness" actually appear in the Bible in the Book of Acts at the early beginnings of the Church: Acts 4:8-11. Peter and John helped a lame man, crippled since birth, walk, and were arrested by the high priests of the Temple. In response: "Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, addressed them, 'Rulers of the people and elders! If you are questioning us today about an **act of kindness** to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed...." as he went on to describe the miracle that was worked through them by the Holy Spirit in Jesus' name. Obviously we aren't expecting anyone to heal a cripple (but wouldn't that be neat! (a)). Your acts of kindness can be small or large, such as buying a gift for a stranger in need at Christmas as Carol has provided opportunities to do, or making a unique and memorable Act of Kindness yourself to someone in need. Whatever you do, please write it down and either email it to me or drop it off at the Church on one of the Sundays in Advent. I will then take care of getting them hung as ornaments on our 28 AoK Christmas Tree!
