- Assisted another neighbor with installing water filter in new fridge.
- Helped friend with tasks in his house and kept him company.
- Visited out of town 91 yr old cousin and took her to dinner.
- Misc. greetings to strangers during walks and in stores.
- Placed "Kindness Matters" bracelet on office entry with positive feedback from a colleague
- Doing kind acts to others and being earnestly thanked
- Donated clothing for men, women and young girls to the Family Center located at the Appoquinimink High School. Donation to less fortunate men and women at the cross-walks.
- Donated to colleague's friend for cancer treatment
